ARTICLES OF FAITH

We Believe and Teach

1. The Divine Verbal Inspiration of the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and their absolute supremacy, infallibility and efficiency in all matters of faith and practice.
2. The Existence of One Living and True GOD—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost—three, the same in essence and equal in attributes, and yet only One Godhead.
3. The Fall and the Total and Universal Depravity of Mankind.
4. The Election and Effectual Calling of GOD, and Man's Freedom of Will to Choose.
5. The Atoning Efficacy of the death of Christ and the Power of His Blood to cleanse the Soul from sin.
6. The full and free justification of believers in Him, by His imputed righteousness and the preservation unto the end of all the saints through the power of the Holy Ghost.
7. The necessity and efficiency of the work of the Holy Spirit in Regeneration and in Sanctification.
8. The Resurrection of the Dead, both of the just and of the unjust—the Christians at the Lord's Appearing, the Israelites at His Coming, and the unbelieving dead at the end of the Millennium.
9. The Virgin Birth and Deity of our Lord; His Sacrificial **Substitutionary Death**; His literal bodily resurrection; ascension to heaven, and His intercession for the saints.
10. The visible Bodily return of our Lord in flesh and bones: (a) At His Appearing in the Air for His Church; (b) At His Coming to the Mount of Olives to establish the Millennial reign of righteousness upon the earth.
11. The everlasting happiness of the righteous and the awful and everlasting misery of the wicked in a literal Hell, prepared for a real personal Devil and his angels.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The Course may be taken by actual attendance upon the classes or by correspondence.
2. **Admission**—Any person of good moral character who has full assurance of his personal regeneration may enrol as a student upon payment of the Registration Fee. (See Application Form at the back.)
3. **Registration Fees**—
 - (a) The following scale of fees will be charged as an evidence of good faith and to cover incidental expenses:—

Single Course \$2.00; Two Courses \$4.00

Maximum Fee for any number of Courses \$5.00.

- (b) Students taking instruction by correspondence must add 50 cents for each course taken to cover postage, etc.
 - (c) At the end of the Institute Year a refund of 50 per cent. of the Registration Fee may be made, provided the student has been in regular attendance upon the classes and has properly and punctually prepared all exercises. The amount refunded will be proportionate to the student's attendance and interest.
4. **Classes** will be held on Tuesday and Thursday nights of each week as follows:

TUESDAY—

- Bible Teaching—7.30 to 8.15.
- Missionary—8.15 to 9.00
- Bible Exegesis—9.00 to 10.00.

THURSDAY—

- Systematic Theology—7.30 to 8.30
- Homiletics—8.30 to 9.15.
- Personal Evangelism—9.15 to 10.00.

5. Each student will be required to supply himself with the necessary books.
 - (a) Authorized Version of Bible and a good Concordance. (We recommend Cruden's or Strong's.)
 - (b) The total cost of all other reference books will not exceed twenty-five dollars for the whole six courses.
6. We desire our courses to appeal to the following classes:
 - (a) Students preparing for the ministry or for missionary fields:

- (b) Sunday school teachers and others who desire assistance in a thorough and advanced study of theological subjects;
- (c) Soul-winners and personal workers who desire to fit themselves better to use the Scriptures.
- (d) All others who desire better equipment for Christian Service and a broader knowledge of the Bible.
7. If any course has not been completed after one year from date of registration, the student must, in order to take up the work again, register anew for the second year.
8. A student may begin a correspondence course at any time during the year. Students in the regular courses in class can only begin the course at the beginning of each session.
9. Each course is divided into Credits, at the end of each of which there is a written test required. Seventy-five per cent. must be secured or the examination will have to be re-written. At the end of each course a preliminary examination for Credit in that course will be held. Fifty per cent is required on this examination.
10. A certificate will be issued to any student who has obtained an average of sixty per cent. of the total marks of any one of the following sections, provided he has attended at least 75 per cent. of the lectures in that course.
