THE BUILDING OF THE INSTITUTE

The Calgary Prophetic Bible Institute is unique in its birth and inauguration. It did not spring up over night. Nine years ago, the Calgary Prophetic Bible Conference was formed by a number of earnest men of different denominations. The intention was to hold a meeting once a week for the purpose of discussing the fundamental doctrines of the Word, more especially those connected with the Second Coming of the Messiah.

For a few weeks the meetings were held in the spacious lecture room at the Public Library, until the attendance became so large that the hall would not hold them, when the Westbourne Baptist Church was secured.

The following year, 1919, the Executive of the Conference secured the Paget Hall and took up the study of the Book of Revelation, to the gratification of a large audience.

In 1920, a larger building was sought, and the committee finally secured the Grand Theatre. Here the meetings were carried on for three years, every Sunday afternoon from October to the end of May.

In 1923, it was thought to move our meetings to the Palace Theatre, as it was more convenient to the street cars and gave us better facilities for a musical program. Here we have remained until the present.

In November, 1925, the Conference entered into contract with the W. W. Grant Co. to broadcast two services per Sunday for the benefit of those in far away places who were not able to get to any religious services. This proved very popular and it was therefore continued. During the last year, a radio Sunday School Department was inaugurated, by which boys and girls, as well as young men and women, could secure free a correspondence course in the stories of the Bible. Here again much interest was shown. The enrolment increased until over one thousand were taking the lessons.

The phenomenal interest of the last year or two, and the awful conditions in many of the denominational theological seminaries compelled the Executive Committee to propose the building and founding of a Bible Institute, where young men and young women (and any others who desire it) might have the opportunity of being trained in Christian work and Bible knowledge without having their faith undermined or their hopes shattered. The proposal caught the ear of our people. From here and there, over Alberta, Saskatchewan, British Columbia, and the Northern States came letters of interest and support. Gradually the contributions mounted up, until the Executive saw fit to begin the building.

After much careful investigation, a suitable site was secured, centrally located and of ready access to street cars from all parts of the city.

Here again the hand of the Lord seemed to be guiding. Very rapidly, the whole project came to completion, and the formal opening is being planned for October.

At a recent meeting, the Executive appointed William Aberhart, B.A., as Dean or Principal of the Institute; and courses are herewith outlined for the opening session.

The building will be capable of seating 1,200 in its auditorium, and can accommodate about 500 day students in the classrooms. A large attendance is expected.

THE AIMS AND PURPOSES OF THE CALGARY PROPHETIC BIBLE INSTITUTE

In our Incorporation papers the following aims and objects are definitely set forth:

1. To hold regularly, Sunday and week-day religious meetings for the purpose of:
 - (a) Winning souls for the Lord Jesus Christ;
 - (b) Edifying the believers everywhere, in the faith once delivered, and
 - (c) Disseminating vigorously the truth of God's Word, which we believe is the Authorized Version of the Old and New Testaments.

2. To use every legitimate, Christian means of combatting and resisting Modernism, Higher Criticism, Skepticism and Secretarianism in all its forms.

3. To teach and instruct people regarding the great fundamental doctrines of the Christian religion so that they will not be led astray by any of the numerous sects or religious beliefs not in strict accordance with God's Holy Word.

4. To conduct a Bible Institute, lecture courses and correspondence lessons for the preparation of young men and young women (or any others who may desire it) for the service of our Master, the Lord Jesus Christ.

5. To broadcast, as often as we can arrange it, so that the people in the Western Provinces and others, may have the privileges, which we can give, of hearing the proclamation of the truth according to the exact, literal interpretation of the verbally inspired Word of God.

6. To establish if possible a Library and Book Room where Christian people and others may secure sound and satisfactory Christian reading matter.

7. To carry on a Radio Sunday School for the sake of many children and young people who have no suitable opportunities for studying the Bible, and thereby to assist parents in the outlying districts to give their children better facilities for Christian instruction.

8. To introduce and carry on any other plans desirable for the spread of the Gospel and the inculcation of the knowledge of the Word of God.

These aims are intended to assist the following six classes of people who may desire to profit by them:

(1) All those living in the near and more remote districts of the Western provinces and Northern States, who feel the need of a regular broadcast of the Word of Truth over the air. These we call our Radio enthusiasts.

(2) All Christians who are seeking the fellowship of Fundamentalists, who stand firmly on the verbally inspired Word of God and who will have no fellowship with those who deny it, or with those who compromise its teachings. We expect that many from the city and country will join our fellowship for the benefit of themselves and others. These we call our Fellowship Members.

(3) Earnest men and women of any faith whatsoever who desire to have a strong testimony to the true Gospel and to the Infallible Word, given in this City and over the air, and who realize the harm that is being done to the rising generation and others by the Modernists, Evolutionists, and skeptics of every kind. These we call our Fundamentalist Associates.

(4) Men and women, who do not intend to devote their entire time to gospel work, but who desire a larger acquaintance with the Bible and Christian methods, so that, while pursuing their regular and ordinary occupations, they may be prepared to work intelligently and successfully in winning others to Christ. These we call our Laymen Forces.

(5) All Sunday School teachers, of any denomination, who desire to be specially trained for the important work that they are trying to do for the Master. These we call the Lord's Vineyard Workers.

(6) Any and all who are willing and anxious to prepare for more specific and definite work for the Master, such as Personal Workers; Colporteurs; Home Missionaries; Foreign Missionaries; Evangelists; Evangelist Singers; Pastor's Assistants; Pastors.

The Executive of the Institute has felt obliged to organize these Christian Training Courses for specialists in these departments, because they realize that we are facing a condition (not a theory) of spiritual things that is very detrimental to the higher life of men and women everywhere. They are convinced that many of the theological seminaries or colleges are disseminating Modernism and infidelity in all their various destructive forms. They realize that the time must come in the very near future when churches here and there throughout this great West, will be calling for fundamental Bible preachers who will be able to teach them the Word of God that liveth and abideth forever.

We welcome to our fellowship any church or churches that desire to stand fundamentally with us in this great fight for truth against infidelity. We hope in the very near future to be able to supply Bible preachers to those who desire such.

May Almighty God give us wisdom in this great enterprise for Him, and may He put it into the hearts of many to realize the present need and give their whole-hearted support thereto.

SPECIAL ADVANTAGES AND PRIVILEGES THE INSTITUTE MAY OFFER

The City of Calgary is one of the hub cities of the Prairie Provinces of Western Canada. Many people, coming into this country, pass through Calgary and often spend days here before they choose the place where they are to settle. It is also the centre of a splendid farming district.

For these reasons, it is unsurpassed as a place in which to learn to do Christian work in all its phases. The importance of Calgary as a commercial centre makes it a Mecca for distinguished travellers from all parts of the world, and the Institute may reap the advantage in that Evangelical leaders of prominence, passing through the city, rarely fail to avail themselves of the opportunity the Bible Institute affords. In this way the students have the privilege not only of listening to them in the class room and on the platform, but also of coming into contact with them, a rare education in itself.

Numerous cultural opportunities are also afforded. The Calgary Public Library is within five blocks of the Institute. Here the very best reading books can be secured.

Night classes in the various Arts and Sciences are conducted during the fall and winter months in the various educational and technical institutions of the City.

Classes in English literature and effective expression will be given in the Institute.

Furthermore, arrangements are being made by which our students may receive instruction in music, vocal or instrumental, at reduced rates under Christian teachers. This will cover any class of instrument—piano, guitar, violin, flute, clarinet, cornet, etc. Thus, while a Bible Course is being taken, a training in music can be obtained. This is extra to the general chorus and song-leading work.

In addition to all these, and in order that our students may be better prepared to make a living for themselves after taking our Courses, we are making arrangements to give a course in Shorthand, Typewriting, and Office Practice, to any who may desire to have it. The Spencerian method of Shorthand and Touch Typewriting will be taught. The experience of others has proven that six months is ample time for a student to gain a fairly good rate of speed and accuracy. This course will also be secured at reduced rates.

The Institute is situated on the north side of Eighth Avenue West, within five blocks of the C.P.R. station, and is easily accessible from every part of the city by electric street cars. The Institute keeps in touch with satisfactory boarding houses where the students may have good homes. Students are not allowed to spend their spare hours in picture shows, dance halls, etc. Good boarding houses may be secured within walking distance of the Institute at special rates to students.

The moral atmosphere of the Institute will be maintained at such a standard as to aid the students in doing their very best in their work and in their lives.

In the case of young men and young women or any others wanting to avail themselves of any of the Institute Courses, but whose circumstances necessitate their employment in other ways during the entire day, the work of the Evening School is so planned as to meet their requirements. The same subjects will be taught but it will simply necessitate a longer time to complete the courses.

Prospective students under the required age (sixteen years) or those who for any other reason are obliged to postpone enrolment in either the day or the evening classes are advised to begin preparatory work in the Correspondence School.

The devotional life of the Institute includes:

- (1) An observance of a time of rest and worship in the homes fifteen minutes before breakfast.
- (2) Devotional exercises at the Institute every morning.
- (3) Attendance at the Young People's Society on Monday evenings and the regular church prayer meeting Wednesday night.
- (4) Special prayer meetings or vesper services from time to time at the Institute for particular objects.

We especially encourage whole families to come in and rent a home from November to April and thus be in a position to accommodate others with them.

We invite correspondence on any matter that is not clear to you.

THE INSTITUTE CLUB MEMBERSHIP

"It is the man behind the plow that does the work"

In order to give our supporters and those in harmony with our great work a chance to express themselves, we herewith draft out the extent to which any support given will assist the Institute project.

There are six classes of members, each of which is prized by us, but varying in the extent to which they can financially support the work.

We fully realize that financial support is not the only kind of help in any great cause. For the prayers of many, and the good words of appreciation and recommendation, we are deeply grateful. They help us much.

We all know equally well, however, from grim experience, that the Light and Fuel bills, the Bricks and the Lumber accounts, the seats and the books, and the cost of broadcasting, to say nothing of conducting Bible Courses and Radio Sunday School lessons, can not be settled up by prayers or kind words of appreciation, without accompanying financial support.

Hence the necessity and importance of our Institute Club. We must pay our accounts.

The following are the six classes of members:

(1) **Radio Sunday School Membership.**

These feel they are unable to support more than the Radio Sunday School from week to week. They contribute from \$1 to \$2 per term. This enables us to give Bible Instruction by mail free to any boy or girl who wishes it.

(2) **Radio Broadcast Membership.**

These desire to help not only the children but the older people scattered here and there throughout the great West, by having a regular broadcast of the Word of God. They contribute from two to five dollars per term. This enables us to broadcast a number of times per week and also to send out suitable literature for religious reading.

(3) **Student Membership.**

The Institute Executive has decided that all those who take classes may take as many subjects as they desire without tuition fee provided they hold a Student Membership in the Institute Club. These contribute from five to ten dollars per term. We want our students to unite in one great band to see that others may have the opportunity that they have had of being taught the Bible in all its simplicity and harmony.

(4) **Sustaining Membership.**

In this membership are included those who, though they may or may not be able to benefit directly from the Radio Sunday School, Radio broadcast, or Bible Courses, are nevertheless in full sympathy with the Institute work, and desire to see all the features mentioned above continued. These should contribute from ten dollars to twenty-five dollars per term. These may enable us to broadcast more frequently, and would encourage us to bring in the prominent, outstanding fundamentalists whenever possible.

(5) **Aggressive Membership.**

The last two classes of members include those who feel more intensely the need of pressing the work of the Institute on as great a scale as possible. They want the Institute to grow and develop in as many spheres as possible—Radio Sunday School, Mid-week Broadcast, free distribution of religious literature, Institute Courses, etc. These contribute from twenty-five dollars to one hundred dollars per term. This contribution may also help the Institute to reduce its debt.

(6) **Super-Institute Membership.**

These members constitute our highest class of supporters. Their interest is manifested in every branch of the work. In addition to that and knowing that we have a debt to square off, they declare their intention of establishing the Institute on a sound financial basis by eliminating the debt as soon as possible, so that those in charge will not have to worry along this line. These contribute one hundred dollars or more per term. For every extra one hundred dollars a letter of the alphabet will

be added, e.g., those contributing two hundred dollars will be registered as Super-Institute "A" members. Those who contribute five hundred dollars will be registered as Super-Institute D, etc.

For the Institute Club Membership, there will be two terms, namely:

The Fall term—September 1st to January 31st.

The Spring term—February 1st to June 30th.

Registrations for the Fall term will be received from the 1st of May until the 30th of November.

Registrations for the Spring term will be received from the 1st of December until the 30th of April.

Now is the time to register; not a month from now. Prompt payment increases the value of your contribution to the Institute. Most of our debts are due early in the registration period. You will impress us with the intensity of your support by registering early.

Age and the State of the Mind

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

1. Age.

Any person, over sixteen years old, may apply for admission as a student in one or more subjects of our Courses. The Institute reserves the right to refuse to accept any application. Conditions in Christendom are so affecting the teaching in many of our colleges and universities, that Christian parents may desire their sons and daughters to be accepted under age, that they may be equipped with a knowledge of the Bible and a deeper spiritual experience to meet the attacks upon their faith when they enter such schools. In such cases, we recommend to the parents, the Correspondence or Radio Sunday School Courses. We believe that it is not wise to send a student to the public university under the age of twenty or twenty-one, so that a student entering at the age of sixteen or seventeen has full time to complete our Courses before entering the University. Our suggestion to parents is this: If possible give your son or daughter, one, two or three years at High School. Then send him to us for our Bible Courses and during the first year let him take one of our Optional Courses, e.g., Shorthand and Typewriting. He will then be able to earn a little during his vacation periods while finishing the second and third years. After that if he desires it he may attend University.

2. Character and Health.

All applicants must give references of good character. They should also be in good health physically, and if any doubt exists in regard to it, a physician's certificate must be obtained. It is also necessary that they should have a desire to learn the Courses and are willing to do the work assigned to them and to be obedient to necessary rules. Any indication of lack in these matters will at once disqualify them for continuance in the classes.

3. Education.

In founding the Calgary Prophetic Bible Institute, the Executive Board has laid down the principle that no man or woman should be excluded simply on educational grounds, but that they should possess a common school education, or its equivalent. It sometimes occurs, however, that the possession of this qualification still leaves the applicant deficient in English. To meet this, the Institute has provided a course in English, compulsory to all such students, and free of charge as in the case of the other tuition in compulsory subjects.

4. Fees and Expenses.

There is no charge for tuition in the regular compulsory or complementary Bible Courses. In all Optional or Equipment courses, such as Shorthand, Typewriting, Music (vocal or instrumental) Sewing, Millinery, Domestic Science, Motor Mechanics, etc., the student will be required to pay. For particular information, write to the Institute office. No student, however, can take any course or credit, unless he or she is a member of the Institute Club. (See Institute Club Membership.)

Room accommodation can be secured in Calgary at rates varying according to location and facilities at from \$2 a week up, Board and room runs from \$.75 to \$1.50 a day in private homes.

Each student will be required to buy his own books and stationery. This will seldom exceed \$3.00 a subject.

5. How to Enrol.

Applicants desiring to attend the Institute classes should address the Dean of the Institute for an application form, which calls for the addresses of three references, and one dollar to pay for all expenses connected therewith. On the return of the application properly filled out and the fee, the references are corresponded with, and if the replies are satisfactory, the applicant is so informed. Applicants should not present themselves at the Institute expecting to be received at once as students, until notified of their acceptance.

6. Time of Entrance.

An applicant may, if deemed wise by the Institute, be admitted as a student in any subject or subjects at any time of the year, but there will be some difficulty in receiving term Credits or standing unless they are present at the opening of the term.

OUTLINE OF COURSES

There will be six Courses offered to the students of the Calgary Prophetic Bible Institute.

1. **The Junior Pass Course.**

This is intended for those who desire to get the rudiments of Bible knowledge so that they may be of ordinary service in their church or Sunday School.

They will be required to take five of the Junior Compulsory Credits and two of the Complementary Credits.

If a student has an optional Credit also, he will be given a Junior Pass Course Plus.....

2. **The Junior Specialist Course.**

This course is similar to the Junior Pass Course with the exception that the three Complementary Credits will be all along the one line.

The required credits in this Course are five Junior Compulsory Credits and three Complementary Credits.

If a student has an optional credit also, he will be given a Junior Specialist Course Plus.

3. **The Senior Pass Course.**

This course is intended for greater service. It should appeal to Senior Sunday School and Adult Bible Class teachers; also to advanced Personal Workers or Colporteurs.

The full course calls for the Nine Compulsory Credits of the Junior and Senior sections and any four Complementary Credits.

4. **The Senior Specialist Course.**

This course is similar to the Senior Pass Course with the exception that the six Complementary Credits will be along the same or correlative lines.

The required Credits in this Course are the nine Credits of the Junior and Senior sections, together with six Complementary Credits.

It is expected that two years will be required to complete this course.

5. **The Advanced Pass Course.**

This Course is drafted for those who intend to give or who are giving their whole time to the service of the Master, such as Evangelists, Evangelist Singers, Home or Foreign Missionaries, Pastor's Assistants, Pastors, Bible Institute Lecturers, etc.

The requirements for this Course will be the full thirteen Compulsory Credits together with any six Complementary Credits.

This is really a three-year Course.

6. **The Graduate Specialist Course.**

This course is recommended rather than the Advanced Pass Course, especially for those who are entering the ministry or the Institute lectureship. This is our Complete Graduate Course.

The required Credits in this Specialist Course will be the full thirteen Compulsory Credits and any eight Complementary Credits.

It is expected that a full three years will be required unless students have previous training.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. In all these Courses, if a student takes an optional Credit, he will be given a Plus.. to his Course.

2. Previous training, either privately or in some other institution, will be recognized, provided that the student can pass an oral or written examination in the subject.

3. The full Advanced or Graduate Courses are outlined to require three years, but any student may complete them sooner by private study or by attending our Summer Schools for this purpose.

4. It is to be understood that no Credit in any subject above the Juniors can be taken until the Junior or lower Course has been satisfactorily completed.

5. These rules apply to Correspondence Courses as well.

6. All Courses except the Optional Courses will be free to the members of the Institute. For each optional Credit, there shall be a charge, reduced for the Institute classes.

Students should make enquiry regarding any course desired.

DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECTS

By this you will get a better idea of the profit and pleasure that will be the lot of the student.

I. **Apologetics and Bible Introduction.**

Under this heading will be taught the "Great Evidences and Proofs" of the Bible and the Christian religion.

In the first year, simple Apologetics, dealing with the peculiar, harmonious unity and singular longevity of the Bible, will be examined, and its magnificent experimental effect upon those who believe it. In addition to this, the arguments dealing with the inspiration of the bible will be presented; and the testimony of the writers, the attestation of the fulfilment of prophecy, and the recent discoveries of archaeology, will be noted in their bearing on the literal accuracy of the Scriptures.

In Bible Introduction, the general structure of the Old and New Testaments will be investigated, and the Dispensational arrangement of their contents will be clearly presented. It has been wisely said that no one can hope to advance in Bible knowledge or to understand the truth of the Scriptures until he has a fairly comprehensive understanding of the dispensations of the Bible.

This is a three-year course.

In the second and third years, the History of the Bible, its Supposed Contradictions, Alleged Mistakes and Discrepancies in Quotations will all be carefully examined, as well as the so-called Immoralities and Scientific Difficulties that are so commonly brought against its reliability.

This Course will be an education in itself.

Two divine injunctions of God's Holy Word must impress the Christian with the need of this subject:

(1) "Sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that it is you with meekness and fear." I Peter 3:15. (Apologetics.)"

(2) "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." II Tim. 2:15. (Bible Introduction).

II. **Systematic Theology and Bible Doctrine.**

In the curriculum of the Calgary Prophetic Bible Institute, everything gives place to the Bible. No matter how well-trained a student may be in any form of practical Christian work for the home or foreign field; no matter how deep his spiritual experience nor how fervent his zeal in soul-winning; no matter what natural gifts or qualifications he may possess; if he be not grounded in the Word of God, he cannot be an entirely safe leader among men, nor can he truly glorify God in his service.

Our courses are not designed to be dry, stereotyped lecture or sermon outlines, that develop a head knowledge rather than that of the heart or soul.

This is a time when men will not endure sound doctrine, but heap to themselves teachers having itching ears. It is therefore most important that earnest Christians should get a broad, comprehensive grasp of the great doctrines of the Christian faith from the Scriptures, free from all human speculation.

This subject is not intended merely to give a thorough, systematized knowledge of Christian doctrine, but rather to relate such a training to the ethics of Christian life. From the very first lesson the relationship of belief and practice will be emphasized.

This is also a three-year course.

In the first year, the doctrines, that will be enlarged upon, will be: The Present Standing and State of the Unsaved; The Origin, Nature, and Fall of Man; The Future Destiny of the Saved and Unsaved; the Birth, Character, and Mediatorial Offices of the Lord Jesus Christ; the Personality and Divine Functioning of the Holy Spirit; and the Great Doctrines of Eternal Life.

In the second and third years, the Doctrine of God and His Infinite Attributes; Christian Characteristics and Graces, including repentance, faith, love, hope, and worship; the Doctrine of the Heavenly Hosts—the Angels and Satan; the Doctrine of the Church, its function and its Ordinances; Comparative Religions, etc., will be studied.

We feel satisfied that when a student has completed this course, he will have a good working knowledge of Bible Doctrine and will not be easily side-tracked by the many heresies on every hand today.

We believe that the parent or the student can rely implicitly on the Word of God which says:

"Take heed unto thyself and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee."—I Tim. 4:16.

III. Biblical and Sacred History.

As a study, this is not intended to give a mere narrative of God's dealings with men and nations, which the student must drill into his mind in a cold, formal way. Such a view of Bible History eliminates all design and purpose and destroys its soul. In Sacred History, there is no attempt to tell all that God has done for mankind. There is a selection of facts. The content of the narrative is subservient to the purpose for which it is told. The real pleasure and profit of this subject lies in the discovery of this design or purpose. Once the student grasps the essential atmosphere of Biblical and Sacred History, its great importance and general scope of helpfulness at once become apparent.

There is no subject in our Courses that is more important in its broad, general usefulness and value to the Sunday School teacher or the preacher than that of Biblical and Sacred History.

This is a three-year course as well.

The first year covers the portion from man's advent into the earth until the end of the period of the Judges, i.e., the Antediluvian Age, the Postdiluvian period, and the early history of God's chosen people down to the time when they sought a King.

The second year completes the Old Testament History, through the Kingdom period and the Captivities, and takes us into the New Testament to the end of Paul's Missionary Journeys when the early Church was established.

The third year will deal in general outline with the great epochs of Church history, tracing its course from its organization through the conflict with paganism from without and heresies from within; the great doctrinal controversies and creeds; the rise, culmination, and decline of the Papacy; the Reformation, and the modern missionary movements.

The full import of the Scriptural statement found in Hebrews 1:1, 2 will be more readily recognized by the students of this subject:

"God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past (History) unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son."

IV. Bible Geography and Oriental Customs.

This subject is not only intended to give a knowledge of Bible lands essential to a right understanding of the Bible, but also to train the student to visualize the printed descriptions of local settings, so that the truth of the Scripture narratives will leave the realm of the imaginative, and become actual and vital. The Bible should be read in the light of real men and nations in a real world, combatting with actual physical conditions, probably somewhat different from ours but none the less effective.

The plan will be to give the student a perspective of Bible lands, to show the distribution of Noah's descendants; the wanderings of the patriarchs; the journey of Israel from Egypt to Palestine; the apportionment of the land among the tribes; the position and extent of the Great World Empires; the missionary tours of the Lord Jesus Christ and his faithful servant, the Apostle Paul.

The course is intended to cover two years.

The first year will deal with Antediluvian conditions and customs, together with the wanderings of the Patriarchs, and the journeys of Israel to the time of the Captivity.

The second year will be especially concerned with Palestine in the time of the Lord Jesus. The student will be expected to trace out carefully the missionary journeys of the Master and the Apostle Paul. The present condition of Palestine will also be noted carefully.

"Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, that the plowman shall overtake the reaper, and the treader of grapes him that soweth seed; and the mountains shall drop sweet wine, and all the hills shall melt. And I will bring again the captivity of my people of Israel, and they shall build the waste cities, and inhabit them; and they shall plant vineyards, and drink the wine thereof; they shall also make gardens, and eat the fruit of them. And I will plant them upon their land, and they shall no more be pulled up out of their land which I have given them, saith the Lord thy God." Amos 9:13-15.

Are you able to visualize this scene? Our course in Bible Geography will help you.

V. Personal Evangelism and Field Work.

It is not intended that the students of this course shall be taught, by mere thumb-rule rote, the method of approaching their fellow-men for Christ.

On the contrary, the student will be taught to diagnose the case as a skilled physician might in physical disease; and then he will be given an analytical knowledge of the passages of the Bible that will solve the difficulty. All classes of problems and difficulties will be faced and a solution discovered. The work of this subject will deal with all manner of exhortation, whether of the unsaved or the saved.

The second or final year will be most profitable in its bearing on Pastoral Theology and Personal Visitation.

In each of these years special training will be given in Field Work including Tract distribution, Colportage work, Cottage prayer meetings, etc.

This Course combined with Homiletics and Effective Expression will prove of splendid worth to those intending to enter the evangelistic ministry.

"They that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever." Daniel 12:3.

Soul-winning is the greatest work in the world. "The fields are white to the harvest and the laborers are few."

VI. Bible Exegesis and Interpretation.

Bible Exegesis means the close and careful examination of the methods by which the Bible declares its truth. This knowledge enables one to discover the content of the Scriptures. It is intended to give a knowledge of the literary style, the forms and the principles of expression that are used in the Bible, not as an end in itself, but as a means of analyzing the content so as to secure a true and exact interpretation.

At once it is evident that this course is essential to all prospective preachers and missionaries, to all Sunday School teachers, personal workers, and others who are anxious to be able to read the Bible without putting themselves under a priestcraft.

The present inability of many to read the Bible is an indication of the prevalent need of such a course.

This is a three-year course. The first year will deal with the Exegetical principles underlying the simpler forms of expression—the sentence, the phrase, the paragraph. The second year will examine carefully the structure of such forms of expression as the riddle, the allegory, the parable, etc. The distinction between the literal and figurative will be clearly dealt with, and the principles of interpretation and truth association will be pointed out.

The third year will examine the Epistle, the Gospels, the historical, prophetic and poetical books by analysis and synthesis.

This course is intended to help the student to carry out the divine injunction: "No prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation." II Peter 1:20.

VII. Homiletics and Effective Expression.

The instruction in this subject covers the fundamentals of effectiveness in public address, whether preaching or teaching or reading aloud the Bible.

The psychology of the audience will be carefully related to the presentation of the address. In fact a complete analysis of methods of presentation of truth will be taken, such as gathering, evaluating and arranging of material, proper systems of filing, clipping and culling items and important paragraphs. Students will be called upon from the very beginning to prepare Bible readings, prayer-meeting talks, gospel addresses and sermons. In the Advanced or third-year work, the various kinds of sermons, topical, textual, expository and evangelistic, will be distinguished and characterized. So far as possible, outside assignments for preaching in missions, churches and street-corners will be given the students when they become capable of filling them.

VIII. Bible Teaching and Sunday School Organization.

This Course will be completed in one year. It is especially designed for Sunday School Teachers and officers, or prospective teachers and officers.

The work will cover two fields, theoretical and practical. Approximately one-half of each lesson will be devoted to each field of work.

The theoretical part of the course will aim to discuss the following aspects: Purpose of the Sunday School; Necessary Personal Equipment for teaching; Jesus the Ideal Teacher; Point of Contact in teaching; Steps in teaching; Teaching Principles; Methods of Teaching; Attention, and how to secure it; Illustration in Teaching.

The practical part of the course will aim to deal with the following: the Teacher's Relationship to the Pupil; the Classification of Periods of Development (Cradle Roll and Beginners, Primary, Juniors, Intermediates, Seniors, Young People and Adult Departments). The general characteristics of each period will be discussed, together with the Conduct of Work in the various departments; illustrative lessons, representative of the various periods, will be taught. In addition, the following topics will be included: The Inter-relation of Church, Sunday School and Home; the Sunday School and Missions; Special Days in the Sunday School; the Organization of the Sunday School; the duties of the Superintendent and other officers.

IX. Literary and General English Course.

In the first year special attention will be given to Milton's Paradise Lost and Bunyan's Pilgrim's Progress.

During the second and third years the remainder of the periods of literature will be considered.

In connection with this course there will be also our Scripture Memorizing training. Recognizing the splendid literary style and diction of the Bible, the Institute has outlined a number of passages that will be required as memory selections.

X. Music.

The instruction in music is designed to equip men and women as gospel singers, choir directors, pianists, church organists, etc., also to aid pastors and directors of religious education in the planning and conduct of the song service in public worship.

In vocal culture, attention is given to the fundamentals necessary to the interpretation and rendering of gospel hymns and the easier works of the masters. The work of the class is confined to elementary study and culture of the voice. Students will be expected to assist in the Choir and Chorus work.

Individual instruction in instrumental music of whatever kind, piano, organ, violin, guitar, mandolin, cornet, clarinet, flute, etc., has been arranged for, and our students can learn to play the instrument of their choice, at greatly reduced rates and under Christian teachers. A full discussion of the Missionary Call will also be held to enable students to know what constitutes a true call, the necessary qualifications, and the essential training needed.

Methods of increasing missionary interest through the Sunday School, Young People's Societies, and Mission Circles, will also be analyzed.
