

Why Alberta Will Vote Social Credit


Some people are under the impression that if Social Credit comes in. they will have to pay a tax of one to two dollars on every pig or cow sold to the packing plants, and have to take their money to the Social Credit bank and receive Social Credit monty iu return. This is all wrong. In the first place, Social Credit does not issue money. In the second place, Social Credit tends to do away with taxes, not increase them.

Social Credit is a scientific method of distributing the surplus goods within the province of Alberta by giving purchasing power to the consumer in the form of basic dividends, sufficient for food, clothing and shelter. For example: 25 dollars credit per month, or 120 million dollars per year.

By giving purchasing power to the consumers it would find a market for ten million dollars worth of goods each month within the province before we produce any more and would start the wheels of progress once again.

Our opposition claim they would put every one to work producing goods to earn money to buy goods. This would not work out because the surplus would still be there and in a short time, the wheels of industry would be blocked again. Just the same results as the N.R.A. in the United States. Under the perfect cycle, the flow of credit would be started by the State advancing to the producers, credit loans free of interest, to enable them to produce the necessary goods. In the work of production these producers really become distributors of purchasing power, transferring their credit to other consumers in the form of wages salaries, payment for raw material,

Realizing that there are many who have no opportunity of obtaining purchasing power from any of these sources the State would advance further purchasing power by issuing the basic dividends to every bona-fide citizen.

The second step would be the fixing of the just selling price of the goods produced. 

Dr. John L. Robinson, who has been announced as the Social Credit candidate for the Provincial constituency of Medicine Hat, came to Medicine Hat in November, 1931, and opened an office here as a chiropractor. Since then he has worked up a good prictise.

Dr. Robinson has always been a student and has many recommendations attesting his proficiency as such.

He was born in Belfast in August, 1890, and received his early tuition from an uncle and aunt in the National School. From 1904 to 1911 he attended the Larne grammar school, for the last 18 months of that period being a science demonstrator. From 1910 to 1912 he was in attendance at the Marlborough training college for teachers and in the following two years was a teacher at the Bushmills boy's school.

In 1913 he came to Canada and in September of that year was granted a certificate to teach in Alberta schools. He taught school at Arbordale, north of Lacombe; Monitor and at Sunset Hill. He went homesteading in 1916 and was farming and teaching until 1929. He was afflicted with sciatica, which turned his attention to the healing art and he took up the study of chiropractic at the Palmer school in 1929, taking the three-year course in two years and traduating with high marks. He returned to Alberta and passed the stiff examination for permission to practice in this Province with flying colors. His ability was recognized in his appointment as a member of the Chiropractic Board for Alberta, on February 13th, 1932.




