

Sketches of Social Credit Members of Legislature

Following are further sketches of Social Credit members of Alberta's eighth legislature:

A. J. Hooke, Social Credit member for Red Deer, was born in England 30 years ago. He came to Canada in 1913 and has been teaching in Alberta schools for nine years, the last five as principal of Rocky Mountain House school. He will be one of the youngest members of the legislature.

Maynard, Beaver River Is 27 Years of Age

Lucien Maynard, Social Credit member for Beaver River, was born in Montreal in February, 1908, and came with his parents to Alberta the following year. He was educated at the Jesuit college in Edmonton and University of Alberta where he received his LL.B. He received his B.A. from Laval university. On taking up law he was articled with Woods, Field, Craig and Hyndman of Edmonton, was called to bar in June, 1932, and shortly after moved to St. Paul where he is at present engaged in private practice.

He is a son of J. A. Maynard, farmer of the Cluny district, is married and has one child three months old. Mr. Maynard has held office for a number of years, and has always taken a prominent part in the affairs of the French-Canadian society of Alberta. He is a Roman Catholic.

Mayor of St. Paul Educated in Quebec

J. W. Beaudry, Social Credit member for St. Paul, was born in Joliette, Que., and educated at Joliette college, later taking his B.Sc., at Laval university. He attended military school in Quebec and held a captain's commission in the old militia. Mr. Beaudry came west in 1913, was admitted to the Alberta bar in 1915 and has been engaged in private practice at St. Paul ever since. Since going to St. Paul he has been secretary of the school for 16 years, secretary of the town for six years and in addition to serving a number of years on the town council has been mayor for the past four years. He has been a director of the chamber of commerce for 10 years. Mr. Beaudry has always taken a great interest in the development of the St. Paul district particularly in connection with railway facilities. He is an active member of French-Canadian societies in northern Alberta. He is married, has three children and is a Roman Catholic.

Dr. J. L. McPherson Resident at Ryley

J. L. McPherson, M.D., Social Credit member for Vegreville, was born in Teeswater, Ontario, 54 years ago. He graduated in medicine from the University of Toronto in 1908. He resides in Ryley and was for many years trustee and chairman of the school board and village

councillor there. He is an ardent sports follower.

Sedgewick Member Has Varied Interests

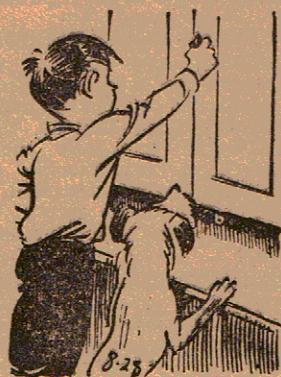

In 1911 he married Stella Roberta Findlay of Walkerton, Ont. They have four sons, Howard Russel, Alberta university graduate in electrical engineering, manager of his father's theatre and in charge of electrical work; Gordon M., Alberta college graduate, manager of the garage; Edward F. and Alan D. attending Killam high school.

MacMillan, Lacombe, Grain Agent at Tees

D. B. MacMillan, Social Credit member for Lacombe, was born Aug. 27, 1887 at Marland, Victoria county, Ontario. He came west in 1901 with his father who was a pioneer homesteader at what is now Tees. He engaged in farming until 1915 when he joined the 89th Battalion, went overseas in 1916 and was transferred to the 10th Battalion in France. For the past 15 years he has been agent for the Independent Grain Co. at Tees. He is married and has two daughters aged nine and 11. Mrs. MacMillan was born at Teeswater, Bruce county, Ont.
