SC Leaders Talk Federal Drive

Campaign plans for the next federal election, which is expected to be held in June of next year, were scheduled to hold the spotlight at a meeting of the national executive of the Social Credit Association of Canada which opened at the Macdonald at 10 a.m. Tuesday. The sessions will last two days.

Rev. E. G. Hansell, MP for Macleod and president of the association, presided. Among others attending are Premier Manning who is provincial leader of the party, Hon. R. W. Bonner, attorney-general for B.C. who, is representing Premier Bennett, Solon E. Low, MP, national leader, and Orvis A. Kennedy, national organizer and president of the Alberta SC league. Most of the 15 SC members of the House of Commons are here, including some from B.C.

From B.C., the group includes Attorney-General R. W. Bonner, Noel Murphy, of Yancouver, president of the B.C. Social Credit league, and W. J. Smith, of Kamloops, a member of the provincial executive.

Expected to attend from Manitoba are B. Rempel, of Portage la Prairie, president of the Manitoba SC league, and W. Tinkler, of Starbuck, second vicepresident of the national association.

The Saskatchewan group is expected to include J. Thauberger, Vibank, president of the SC league, and M. Kellyn, of Regina, a member of the provincial executive.

On Tuesday, general reports are to be given from the various provinces. The national executive will continue Wednesday with consideration of matters in detail.

Social Credit leaders already have announced that they plan to contest all 70 seats in the four western provinces in the next federal election.
