# Manning Students Triumph In Quiz

Students from Ernest Manning High School Sunday scored the highest number of points this year when they appeared on Students' World.

The two boys and one girl from Ernest Manning received a total of 47 points. The three students from St. Mary's Boys, who appeared on the same program, were awarded 28 points.

The Ernest Manning students, David Jones, Sarah Weaver, and Mike Ivens, scored 20 team points. It was the first time this year that a team has been awarded the maximum number of 20 points for the question on which all three members confer.

The students from St. Mary's Boys were: Jay Ryan, Greg Owen, and John Wojtkiw.

Judges for the program, which tests students on their knowledge of current events, were Dr. Horst Betz and Michael Lapidge, both of the University of Calgary. Moderator of Students' World is Pete LaValley.

Students from city and district high schools compete for \$1,500 in scholarships on the Channel 2 program, which is sponsored by The Calgary Herald and CHCT-TV.

In the final program, March 5, members of the winning team

will each receive scholarships of \$200. Runners-up will receive \$150 scholarships, while the two other teams which make the semi-finals will receive \$75 scholarships.

Next Sunday the second program with rural students will be seen. Students from Cochrane and Springbank will appear then.
