(1). "The Soldier with a Main Track Mind".

Introd: - (1). What is most objectionable quality of a

mosquito? NO, not his sharp proboscis. .prototype of all hymodermic needles (mere human imitations) .. NOR irritation produced by his (perdon me, HER) attack. Most miserable quality is her ONE-TRACK MIND! Refuses to be side-tracked until sidesmacked! Persistent to point of obstinacy! (2). To say of human being "One-track mind" is usually an insult. Not always justified as such. Sometimes we make accusation bec. rerson will not see thingsour way .. (Right way!) Some become obsessed with one surreme desire .. devote life to it. c/f Money .. some worshir trinity of Gold. silver and conner. Their straight, inflexible path crosse every "S" in their sneech, and turns it into doller sign. One-track! Others are snorts-mad .. nleadure-mad .. sex-mad . Running full steam along side-tracks..made them mein-track (3). God save us from one-tracks and side-tracks. But enother danger is "All-tracks". The hail-fellow-well-met runs this way. Runs with the here .. and with the hounds. Piece of flabby amiability . "Ant - ability". Able to be friends. .with everybody! No rubing passion. .no conviction .. going nowhere in 17 directions! c/f Pharisees .. Mark 11: 29-33. God save us from being "All-Track minds" .. like "all thing Hindus with 400 mill. gods. fitted to ev. occasion..compan ball men WHAT DOES GOD EXPECT OF US? Well-developed, many track minds..like Solomon I Kings 4:32-33..Like our Lord..who based marables on farming and fishing and baking and horticulture and prospecting and merchandising and investing and weddings and births and house-building ... on and on. BUT IN TRULY FOUNDED LIFE THERE MUST BE ONE MAIN TRACK and all these others feeding into it .. contributing to it.

I. Let me take you to little-known signif. illus of this.

(a). Four characters involved, a king, a prince, a general and an unknown soldier. Let me first of all read record. II Sam. 18:1,/5, 9-14. Now may God sneak to all of us!

(b). The first character in story is King David. At this time a rejected King. A minority of meonle still loyal to im in spite of general rejection. Followed him. shared his exile. his contempt. his despising. Willing to suffer shame for love of the King. Forsook ev. worldly advantage .possession. lived as strangers, wanderers, milgrims, not knowing what shead. when called upon to die for King. havin no certain dwelling place. hardy soldiers. AND THERE IS A CLOSE PARALLEL TO THIS. Habatax I Con 4:8-17. Todaywee have a rejected King. Cur Lord Jesus. and we live in this world as a minority. called to be His good soldiers.

(c). The second person in the story is the Prince .. Absolom. Brought into being by the King. Good name that his life belied Ab-Shalom.. "Father of Peace"..and he stirred up bitter war. sought life of one who brought into existence..usurred him.. And here I think of another like him. . Good name of Lucifer ... "Light". "shining .. morning star" .. And became author of all darkness..desmair..sin..Satan. Sought to demose his Make and today is Frince of this world. John 14:30 . Actually kinded the Prince of Life. Today hailed by multitude . . obeyed . . enjoyed . And only oprosed by minority .. and these he hates and hunts . The King and the Rebel! In deadly conflict then .. and today. Mind of Rebel set to destroy King and all He has. "Migh Treaser II. The rest of the story concerns two of King's soldiers. (a). Both filled with honest zesl. Good fighters. Knew their business. Mind had a soldier-track in it. One was General Josb .. named .. well-known. Other was common soldier .. unnnamed in record.. snonymous in life and death. No record of who was. Look first at General Joab. for he respresents many of God's soldiers today. On the battle-field for the King. A leader fully qualified to lead. Bold, brave, successfull, strong, keep BUT HE FINALLY REBELLED AGAINST KING HE HAD SERVED SO LONG! Staggering truth! IN Kings 2:28-29, 34. In his life there was one fetal flaw. Learn it! You know story. Absolom caught up in oak tree. Per. by long heir. Here is lesson by the way. He was proud of his beauty. When hed yearly hair-cut.. even weighed it to see how much grew! Some MAN! So, as wride was Satan's downfall..so of Absolom. Pride catches many a man leaves him "hung up" .. helpless .. leaves him dangling . NO WALK! 2000 (b). Then was Josh's opportunity. for glory, fame. Killed him. IN DIRECT DISOBEDIENCE TO KING'S EXPLICIT COMMAND! Why do that? Well, he RATIONALIZED sway King's command. Sub. own human wisdom. "practical..sensible". "I think I know better". And it was beginning of the end for Josb. The first seed of rebellion and rejection. A LITTLE disobedience. c/f young man, women..marry unsaved. c/f "Here am I, send my sister". "Bring ye all the tithes"..Don't love God dime in dollar. TIME WE LEARNED GOD MEANS EXACTLY WHAT HE SAYS. OBERY GOD. (c). Well, here is 4th man in story .. Anonymous .. Unknown soldier He seems so insignif .. s but sturid . . desnised of the desnised . Hated by enemy .. and acorned by own general .. not worth havirationce with (vs.14). Not worth naming in the records. BUT .. This man .. many tracks to mind .. a soldier .. rob . husband . fether .. citizen .. This men found in place in God's record bec. he did two things .. one positive .. one negetive. HAD A MAIN TRACK 1. He knew the King's command .. and implicitly obeyyed it . (2 valla) vs. 12b THE MAIN TRACK! Center of life.will. Cur Lord said of Himself "I COME TOW DO THY WILL, O GOD". DO WE? Like this glorious unknownsoldier? c/f Blank sheet..sign name..?

Tak self vital ques. Do I, to utmost knowledge..OBEY the commands of my King? Obeyy the BOOK? The SPIRIT?

2. Second rail to main track certainly of equal immortance for first demends upon it. Parallel tails to make one main track...THIS UNKNOWN HERO.REFUSED PROFFERED REWARD FOR TAKING A SIDE*TRACK! Without that rugged self-demial he would never have obeyed God's command. Read again:

vs. 10-12a. Offered goodly sum of cash..AND A GIRDLE...

BELT OF OFFICE..symbol of position. promotion..raising from ranks of ordinary soldiers to that of a commissioned officer..Among Heb..such a richly wrought girdle was mark of honour..oft. bestowed as reward of military merit.

AND THIS MAN SAID "NO". "Not even if put 1,000 shekels actually in my hand..I would drop it". HE DIED TO SELF. And thus able to LIVE UNTO GOD..HEARING..OBEYING HIS WORD.

Conclus: - 1. I leave the amplication in your hands. It is unmistakeable. Already our hearts surely asking. "AM I on the main track .. where God wants me? Am I set to do His will?" All work of Setan will be to sidetrack .. make something else more imm. then doing will of God with a sel that has died. Saten will bid high. Illus: - Hounds and coyote and rabbit. Bid for you..shekels..honour..fame promotion.. 2. And in it all we may seem to lose out in our obeying of God's commands. May mean insignif..loss.. secrifice .. desth. This soldier lost, didn't he? Or did he? Mis earthly king prob. never heard of him. what he refugsed to do. what he did. BUT IN HEAVEN THE GREAT KING KNEW . WROTE THE RECORD HERE. What office will he have in God's Kingdom? How compare then with Josb? And our KING still knows .. and His reward is in His hand! Jum Eller .- "He is no fool, who gives what he cannot keen,

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Nark 11:29-33..And Jesus answered and said unto them, I will also ask of you one question, and answer me...The baptism of John, was it from heaven or of men?...And the reasoned within themselves..If we shall say, From heaven; he will say, Why then did ye not be lieve him?
