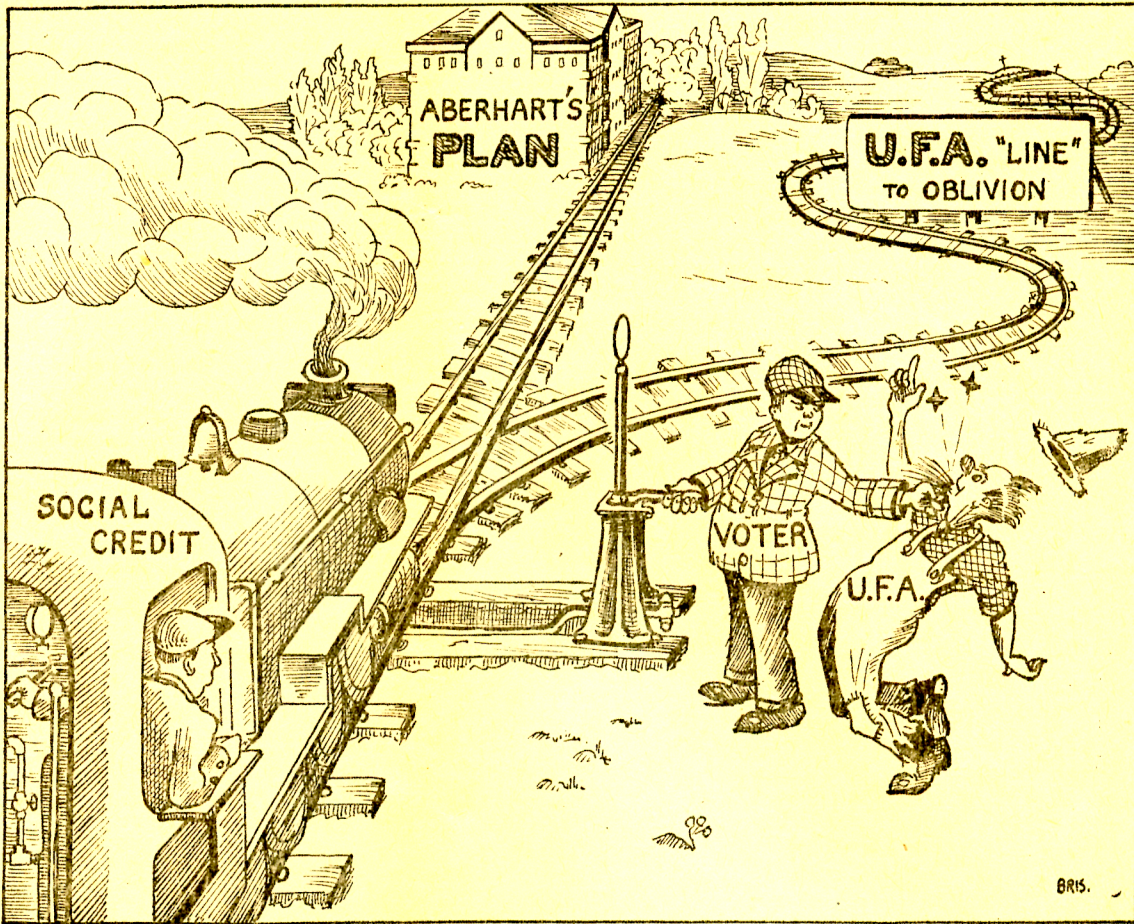
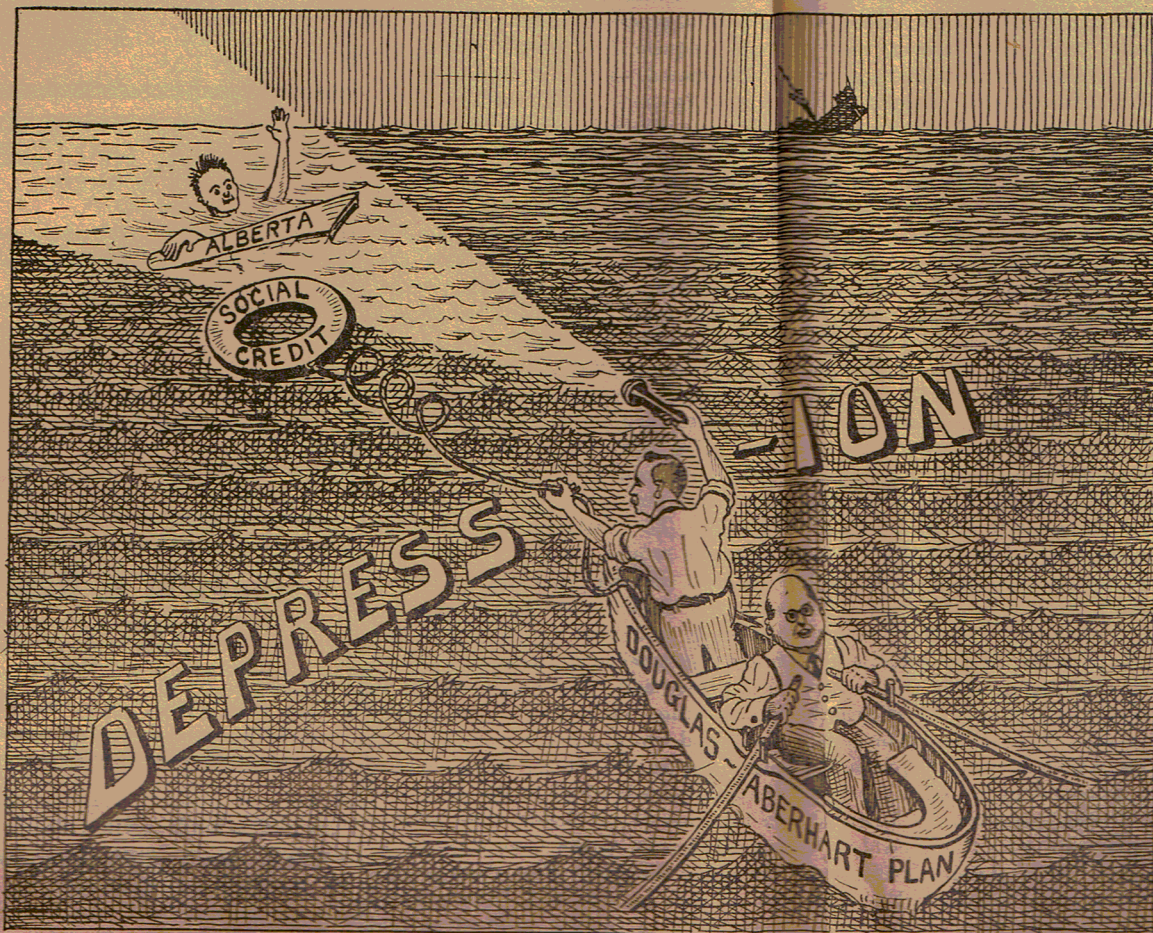

right on anyhow.

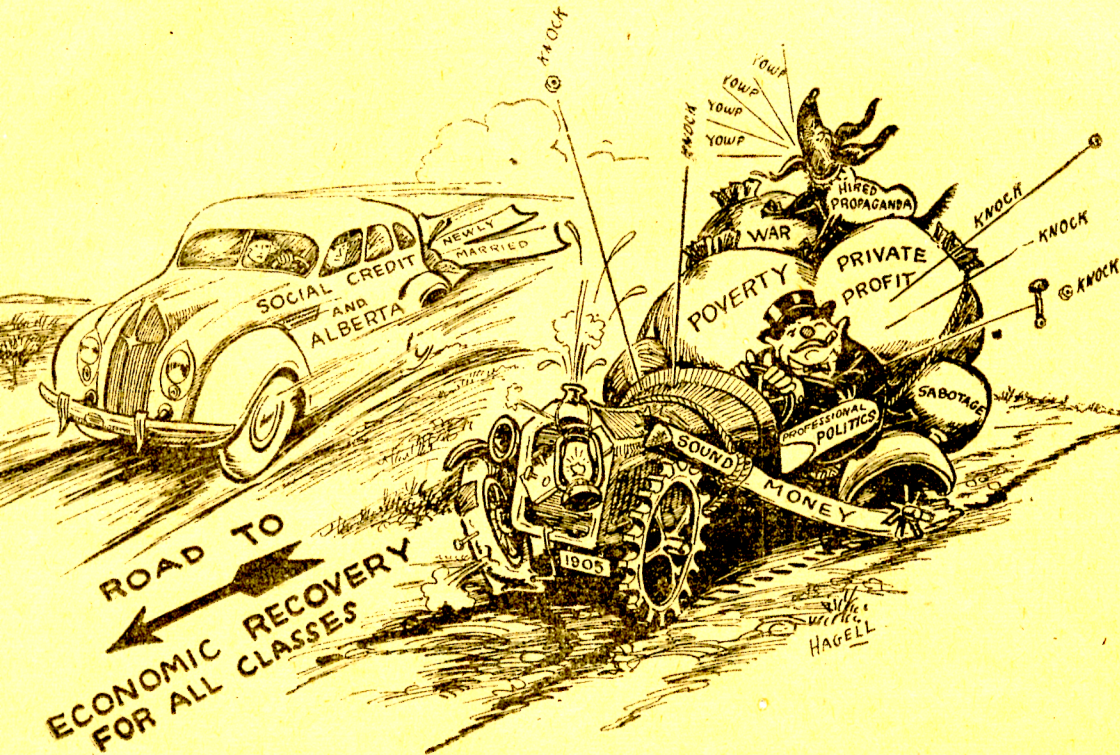
How do you do, Mackenzie King,
