The Plea of McKenzie King for Election in 1935

Speaking at Saskatoon he said:

Until the control of currency and credit is restored to the Government all talk of sovereignty of Parliament and democracy is idle and futile."

Think It Over!

Before joining the McKenzie King Cabinet the Hon. Norman Rogers was Professor of Political Science in Queens University, and speaking from a learned professor's point of view stated:

"I am thoroughly convinced that the B. N. A. Act is not a pact or a contract either in the historical or legal sense."

Why does HE now, as a member of the McKenzie King Cabinet, agree that the B. N. A. Act is legal and is being violated?

Is It Politics? Is It the Voice of the Bankers?

Dr. Beauchesne, K.C., C.M.G., LL.D., Clerk of the House of Commons, in his testimony before a Special Committee of the Commons in 1935 said:

"That the statute of the B. N. A. Act is NOT a compact between the provinces; that the Act did not even embody all the resolutions passed in Canada and in London prior to its passage by the British Parliament; and, further, that clauses were inserted which had no sanction from the provinces."

The true preamble of the B. N. A. Act, as it appears in the original bill, clearly states its own indefinite purpose on its title page, on which its purpose is set out in the following terms:

"By reason of the request of the colonies for Federal Government, it is expedient therefore that they have laws and regulations to GUIDE THEM."

The purpose of the Act thus expressed was not conveyed to the people of Canada. On the contrary, it seems to have been deliberately withheld from them, for the title page and preamble of the B. N. A. Act did not appear with copies of the Act which have circulated in Canada since its passage by the British Parliament in 1867.

There is nothing queer about THE PEOPLE claiming sovereign power within their own Province when none of those powers have been delegated. Complete sovereignty was given by the people of England to THE PEOPLE of the Provinces, and it is for THE PEOPLE to use the sovereign power inherent in them through whatever authority they wish to set up for the purpose.

Any Other Concept Is a Negation of Democracy.

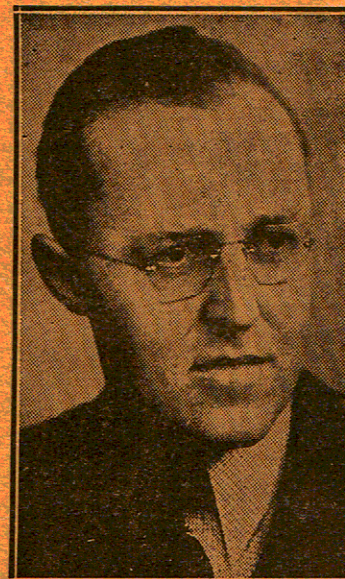
